The Netherlands will continue to contribute to the Resolute Support Mission with approximately 160 military personnel, incremental costs are approximately (24) million euro.

In 2020, the Netherlands will continue to contribute to the NATO Mission in Iraq with up to 20 military and civilian personnel, for which the costs are (1) million euro.

The Netherlands will continue to provide a company with enablers in the German-led enhanced Forward Presence battlegroup (270 pax) in Lithuania. Incremental costs of this operation are approximately 22 million euro.

In 2020 and 2021 the Netherlands contributes to both the enhanced NATO Response Force and the NATO Readiness Initiative. The Netherlands is currently not able to meet all NRF and NRI requirements, due to ongoing efforts to restore readiness levels and ongoing contributions to missions and operations.
