



## Victims of child abuse during the past year





## Victims of domestic violence during the past 5 years, 2017





Reports to Safe at Home, by nature of the violence/abuse




Safe at Home received 65 thousand reports during the first half of 2019



## Advice given by and reports to Safe at Home, by suspected duration of the violence




38% of the reports to Safe at Home concerned acute cases and/or cases involving long-term dangerous situations



## Safe at Home cases taken to next stage




#### Police notifications to Safe at Home


## Two-year recidivism of convicted persons in 2015
