The secure section of the JJIC is mainly intended for young people with serious behavioural problems who benefit the most from a secure setting. This also prevents absconding. This section is intended for only for young people who have committed an offence. The JJIC sometimes allocates children subject to an OTS order to the secure section, with the approval of the juvenile judge, for a brief time-out. These are children who display aggressive behaviour or behaviour contrary to social norms for short periods of time.

At this moment there are six young people held in the secure section of the JJIC: two subject to a PIJ order, one subject to an order for temporary remand in police custody (IVS), one subject to an OTS order and one in youth detention.





- **d.** Children are not officially removed from Curaçao. They are reunited with their family in their country of origin. No record is kept of the situation; nor are such individuals prohibited from returning legally.
- **e.** There is no general asylum procedure. Instead, there is a general protection policy in line with article 3 of the ECHR. Unaccompanied children fall under government responsibility following a special court procedure. They stay in local children's facilities. If their parents are traced in their country of origin, reunification takes place there. If the parents are in the country but undocumented, they have to apply to the authorities and follow the correct procedures.

**52a** The number of young people held in pre-trial detention in the JJIC 's secure section varies from one to six.

**52b** In addition to the secure section (see 42b), the JJIC also has an open section where young people who can cope with an open setting, including the freedom provided, are housed. Everyone has their own bedroom. Young people who do well are permitted to go shopping or visit their homes without supervision.

The secure section is intended only for young people who have committed an offence. See above.

**52c** The JJIC is a residential educational institution that focuses on improving the future prospects of young people subject to supervision orders. Currently, six young people are being held in the JJIC's secure section.

**K.53a** There are no reports of the sale of children.

**53b:** Since this has not been reported, no investigation is required.

**53c** For the same reason, there are no victims of this crime.

**L.54a** There is no general asylum procedure. Instead, there is a general protection policy in line with article 3 of the ECHR. There is no special procedure under which children can apply for protection but there are special facilities where children can stay when such cases present.

Policy on immigration detention for minors states that accompanied minors will be placed in a shelter with the assistance of the Victim Support Foundation Curaçao and the Ministry of Social Affairs until they can be removed. If family care is possible and after investigation, undocumented families can go to a verified address. They have a reporting obligation and the necessary guarantees for them are put in place. The background of unaccompanied children is investigated, after which they are placed with a family with a verified address. A notification obligation and the necessary guarantees are put in place. If reception is not an option, voluntary placement with one of the relevant organisations will be arranged. If a minor invokes article 3 of the ECHR, this will be considered in light of the CRC. Applications from children have priority as described in the ECHR procedure.
