### **The Danish Model for Procurement of Weapons from the Ukrainian Defence Industry**

#### *Government-to-Government-to-Business Donations*

- Denmark funds military capabilities produced by the Ukrainian defence industry through financial donations to Ukraine.
- The purpose of the Model is to:
  - Increase military support for the Ukrainian Armed Forces.
  - Expand the production capacity of the Ukrainian defence industry.
  - Ensure the swift delivery of prioritised capacities.
  - Reduce the requirement for training.
  - Ensure that Ukraine is able to sustain and maintain these capacities.
- In 2024, Denmark supported implementation on behalf of the European Union through the European Peace Facility, utilising windfall profits from immobilised Russian assets.
- In 2024, weapons worth approximately €590 million were delivered through the Danish Model. These were funded by:
  - The Danish national Ukraine Fund: Approximately €175 million
  - Windfall profits from immobilised Russian assets on behalf of the EU through the European Peace Facility: Approximately €390 million
  - Contributions on behalf of Sweden: Approximately €20 million
  - Contributions on behalf of Iceland: Approximately €2.7 million
- The deliveries in 2024 included:
  - Artillery systems
  - Medium- and long-range strike drones and drone systems
  - Anti-tank missiles and systems
  - Anti-ship missiles and systems
- By delivering on a large number of highly requested capacities, the Model has proven to be an effective means of funding the Ukrainian defence industry.
- Denmark, Norway, Sweden, Iceland and Canada have pledged financial contributions to continue the Model in 2025.
